



## Big City Brewing Tasting Rooms in San Francisco

San Francisco is famous for its eclectic breweries. **Thirstybear Restaurant and Brewery** is housed in an historic brick building across from the Moscone Center and San Francisco Museum of Modern Art. Thirstybear serves authentic Spanish tapas along with nine rotating beers on tap. All beers are hand-crafted and organic. One of the oldest breweries in town, **Anchor Brewing** is famous for Anchor Steam beer and located right here in the heart of the city. For a more bohemian experience, visit **Magnolia Pub and Brewery** on Haight Street, where you will be surprised to find this restaurant and brewery squeezed into a tiny former pharmacy building, housing the brewery underneath in a relatively small basement. Magnolia built a seven-barrel facility under its pub. Above, the restaurant serves delicious gourmet pub fare in a bustling but cozy atmosphere, and their changing beers are chalked up on the board, with names like Prescription Pale Ale, Cole Porter, Stout of Circumstance, and Old Thunderpussy Barleywine. 1398 Haight St., 415.864.7468.
